

A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR WHAT DREW YOU TO WRITING KENNY AND THE STICKY TRAP?

Kenny and the Sticky Trap is essentially an environmental awareness story discouraging the use of sticky traps, which are commonly used to catch bugs and rodents. Having a background in veterinary nursing I have seen many native birds (including kookaburras), lizards and small marsupials come through the emergency vet hospital with sticky trap injuries.

Kenny, on the other hand, is a free-spirited, happy, healthy, young kookaburra much like what we would see flying around early in the spring time.

WHEN DO YOU GET INSPIRATION FOR YOUR BOOKS?

Most of my inspiration comes from animals, both Australian native wildlife and pets. My stories are usually fact laced with fiction and are birthed from my background in veterinary nursing. Kenny, for example, was a real wild kookaburra who came through our emergency hospital one night when I was on shift. He was found stuck to a sticky trap that someone had left out in their backyard.
