



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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR WHEN DID YOU FIRST REALISE YOU WANTED TO WRITE?

When I was young, in primary school. Just the idea of, 'wow, I can *make* that happen in my head?' came to me when I was around seven years old and it never left. But, after writing my first fanfiction at the age of fifteen and getting positive responses, that was when I started writing my own stuff.

WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR IDEAS FOR YOUR BOOKS?

Ideas come from imagery, for me. All the planets in *The Parallel Girl* were designed from thoughts I had about images in film, video games, other books, music or real life. That, and I get good ideas from really bad ideas for characters and plots that seem completely unworkable. The challenge of being able to justify these in a narrative makes me laugh, but those attempts of working the unworkable actually lead to more sensible, but still eclectic ideas for stories. *Morse and Rake* started from the idea of two kidnappers needing to kidnap people in the climax of a story in order to save them. And look what that turned into!
