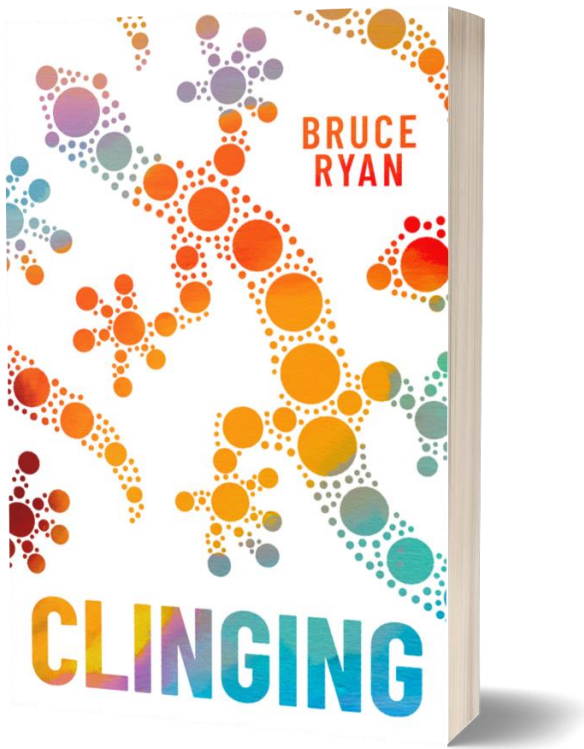


Clinging

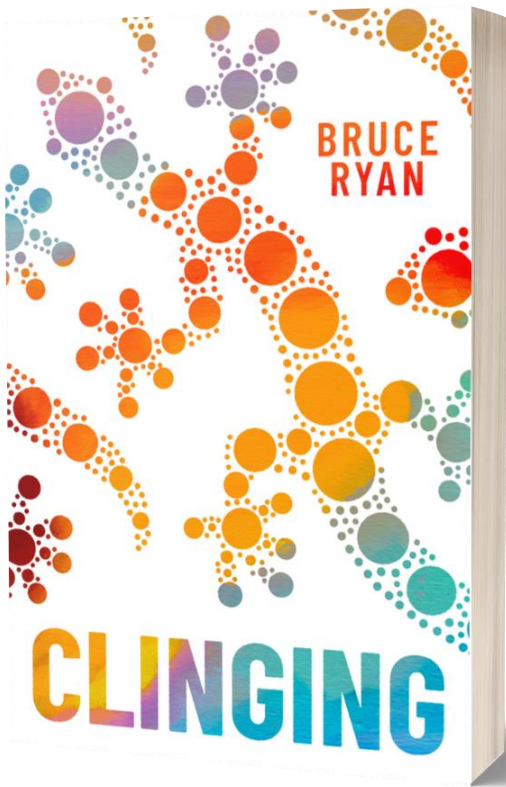

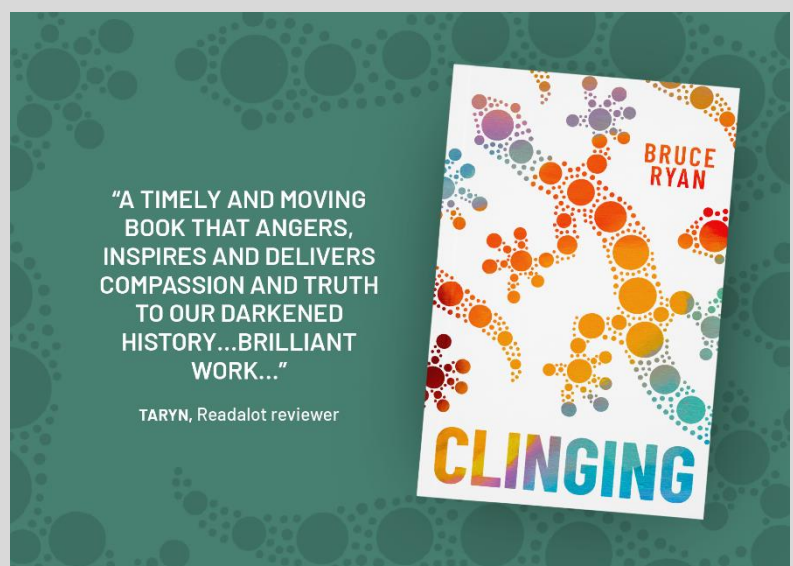
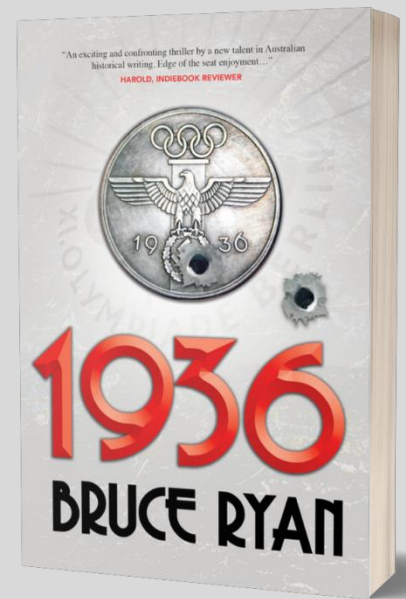
