

Walk her journey through these emotional and inspiring pages to see Ludmila rise from oppression to freedom, from Ukraine and Germany and then to Australia.


## ABOUT THE AUTHOR

### A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

#### WHEN DID YOU FIRST REALISE YOU WANTED TO WRITE?

I have always loved writing. When I was seventeen, I wrote four goals for my life. One of those goals was to write a book. However, I did not begin writing until 2014 when I was sixty-three.

#### WHAT WAS YOUR RESEARCH PROCESS LIKE?

While researching and writing Ludmila's story, the period from May 1945 until end of 1949 was a blank. Then, Margie, my Ukrainian sister-in-law was sent photos of documents belonging to Ludmila, Mykola and baby Mykola. These documents filled in all the blanks - where they were, what they were doing. The original documents had been destroyed, but at least we had those photos. I was finally able to fill in those four missing years.

During my research trip with Jenny, my neighbour, in 2019, we were taken to Ludmila's and Mykola's first house, on the floodplain of Maitland which they had to vacate when the floods filled that house to the roof line. We were also taken to the hotel where they were billeted upstairs, while the floodwaters surged through the building, beneath their feet. In Bonegilla we saw Block 19, the little tin hut they lived in, and the kitchen, hospital and creche where they had worked while at Bonegilla between 1949 and 1954.
