


J.J. Pomykala is an author residing in Western Australia, who has worked in the public sector for most of his life, in the areas of governance, policy, and strategy.

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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF *THE BOY IN BLACK*?



WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR INFORMATION OR IDEAS FOR YOUR BOOKS?
