



A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF *BEN* AND THE MOUNTAINS AND THE CHARACTERS WITHIN? Having moved about a lot when I was younger, I was always an outsider and became an acute observer of people, even more so when my family broke up.

WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR INFORMATION OR IDEAS FOR YOUR BOOKS?

Personal experience mostly, but then I begin researching subjects as characters. I use travel books and maps to supplement my own trips to areas that I write about in my books.

WHAT WAS YOUR HARDEST SCENE TO WRITE IN *BEN AND THE MOUNTAINS*?

Intimacy scenes, both physical and emotional, were the hardest to write, although I tend to stay away from the physical for the most part and leave that up to the reader's imagination. Finding a balance of how much emotion to put in given that many of my characters are by nature very closed people was also a difficult element of writing *Ben and the Mountains*.
