

The past may just hold the answers Lillian needs to thwart a conspiracy that threatens to change the balance of political power forever.


ABOUT THE AUTHOR

WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR INFORMATION OR IDEAS FOR YOUR BOOKS?

My ideas and inspirations often come from travel experiences or memories of past events, sometimes historical. Remembering interesting people I've encountered over the years is a definite source.

WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF *CODE* 1990.

I was inspired by an experience visiting then-East Germany, a visit to a former concentration camp in West Germany and the potential danger faced by going through Checkpoint Charlie into East Berlin. Linking this to the nefarious plots of the Stasi gave me the background to *Code* 1990.

DID YOU HAVE ANY INTERESTING EXPERIENCES WHILE RESEARCHING OR WRITING CODE 1990?

Writing *Code 1990* brought back memories of my visit to East Germany in 1975, being buzzed by a Russian military helicopter on the Autobahn and a poignant warning from a British M.P. in West Berlin, advising against speaking to East Berlin locals while there (you can be falsely accused of spying and arrested). Quite sobering.
