

ABOUT THE AUTHOR





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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE GRIT?

I first started writing *Grit* at the tail end of my adolescence. I've lived a turbulent life and at the time I'd just come out of a particularly challenging period of it. One part of my life was now behind me while the next part of it stretched out bleakly in front of me. At the very least however, I could take comfort in the fact that I'd gotten a good story out of what had happened to me.

And that's how the idea of *Grit* began in my head. I wanted to capture the timbre of my life, long stretches of ennui punctuated by moments of furious action, instead of taking the autobiographical approach. Around the same time, I discovered the concept of Gonzo and its unapologetic candour yet conscious distortion of the truth. With that, I now had a story and a particular style that I could tell with. The writing of the novel came to me very easily afterwards.

HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH YOUR TITLE?

It came from the following quote from Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas: "But our trip was different. It was a classic affirmation of everything right and true and decent in the national character. It was a gross, physical salute to the fantastic possibilities of life in this country-but only for those with true grit. And we were chock full of that."
