

After Eva settles in Nimbin, a relaxed and alternative town with a celebrated counterculture, discoveries and life-changing surprises show her how things can change so quickly.


ABOUT THE AUTHOR

A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE *THEY MAKE CHEESE IN NIMBIN,* DON'T THEY? WHAT WERE YOUR INSPIRATIONS?

I met a someone in Nimbin who immediately I knew would be a protagonist in a book about several families who would end up in Nimbin. The town itself has many interesting characters including a pair of peacocks named Mary and Jesus (and their chicks) and several feral roosters that terrorise kids at times. I wanted to write a story about a family that end up in Nimbin.

All families have a "story" so creating my fictional family came easily. I just had to recall characters I have met over the years or heard about and put them into the various roles I needed in my story.
