
Dislocation


Since, he has completed a master's degree focusing on climate/energy politics from UNSW, writing articles on energy and climate geopolitics in his spare time.



A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR WHAT LITERARY PILGRIMAGES HAVE YOU GONE ON?

I travelled South America in 2001 and in 2010 on a motorbike after volunteering in Haiti after the earthquake. This experience led to the creation of OsierCarbon, a tree planting charity that contributed to the crystallisation of the novel in my mind. I spent 3-4 weeks a year in Malaga in the South of Spain at my uncle's house, writing *Dislocation* on the beach in the sun, drinking rum and smoking cigars.

WHAT DOES LITERARY SUCCESS LOOK LIKE TO YOU?

Dislocation is warning about climate change with a message of hope if we act. I started in 2014 when the world was sleepwalking into a crisis. My goal was to educate people about the risks and help turn public opinion. People don't change behaviour based on facts, they change based on emotions, so telling a story, instead of citing scientific papers, seemed like the way to go. Therefore, success is about spreading the message for me, rather than any financial reward. If some meaningful number of people consume my work and change their opinion on climate change, that is success (although public opinion now is very different, in a good way, than 2014). I would love to write a sequel because I loved the process. That would entail some sort of financial incentive, however.
