

Weeping Willow follows the young idealist as he navigates the changing times of history when the nineteenth century comes to an end with a great upheaval...


ABOUT THE AUTHOR

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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE WEEPING WILLOW?

I wrote this book out of an interest in the Victorian Era and the Russian Empire, which was, at that time, considered a somewhat lesser country in terms of progress and development, but still a well-respected one. I was interested in how a country finds itself in that situation, particularly seeing as the Russian Empire was actually overthrown owing to its situation.

My main inspiration was *I*, *Claudius*, a fictional autobiography of a historically prominent person. I liked the style, and opted to write a fictional autobiography myself, choosing an interesting point in history that does not seem particularly important, but in reality was perhaps a missed opportunity for many forces to make things different.

HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH THE TITLE?

The title is actually a term used historically to refer to the main character by those who were close to him. They called him the weeping willow for his distinctiveness and his sad nature; for, like the weeping willow tree, George Romanov was tall, handsome, and yet marred with a certain sense of sadness owing to his circumstances. I cannot think of what else I would've named the book, and so I thank the people of the past for this apt, sad name.
