

Who can rescue David, hunt down the criminals, and prevent a paradox from erasing the Thomas family from the annals of history...?


ABOUT THE AUTHOR

A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

HOW LONG DO YOU SPEND RESEARCHING BEFORE BEGINNING A BOOK?

That depends on the information I am seeking. For searching through historical records, weeks and months, depending on the level of detail required and the ease with which the information can be accessed. For a question on science, machinery, geographic location, and landscapes, especially for a story in a contemporary setting, it may be a few days to a week. Google street view can be a great asset for checking out a location without having to visit the site in person, as an example.

WHAT'S THE MOST DIFFICULT THING ABOUT CREATING CHARACTERS?

I have no idea how another person's thought process truly works, no matter what their gender or circumstance. I want my characters to have opinions, prejudices, loves, hates, and interpersonal interactions that are as close to reality as I can get them. So, when I am writing characters, I tend to use observations from people I actually know and base my writing on how I have witnessed them behave in a similar circumstance.
