


Will lives on the Mornington Peninsula where he lives with his wife who tolerates his sense of humour and encourages his writing.


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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE 'DEATH ON THE FERRY HYGEIA'? WHAT WERE YOUR INSPIRATIONS?

I'm a fan of crime and murder mysteries like most people. One of the great titles in this genre is Murder on the Orient Express. Because of my interest in the old ferries, I thought maybe I could write a mystery/ murder story based on the most famous of the old fleet Hygeia.

HOW HAD YOU DECIDED ON THE BEST CHARACTERS FOR THE BOOK?

They just evolved. I wrote the roles for them and then fitted them in. Obviously, we needed a murderer and a victim and of course a copper to bring the miscreant to heel. I couldn't make the killer or the victim/s too obvious, so the story develops around Constable Jim Foley and his colleagues.

HOW DO YOU CREATE OR MODEL YOUR CHARACTERS TO FIT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE STORY AND THE EXPECTATIONS OF THE READERS?

I want someone who the reader might identify with. The policeman had to be a little fallible, subject to mistakes but still an ambitious leader who inspires those around him by his doggedness and courage. Other characters appear almost by themselves in support roles or as antagonists.

WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF THE BOOK AND ALSO THESE CHARACTERS WITHIN?

There is a lot of local history that younger generations know nothing about. Fascinating stuff that could and should inspire more writers. Explore the bays fortifications. Why did the USS Rattlesnake visit Melbourne during the US civil war? Who was Buckley and why did he live with the Indigenous People of the area? Who was the pirate rumoured to have hidden a vast fortune just inside the heads?

HOW LONG DO YOU SPEND RESEARCHING BEFORE BEGINNING A BOOK?

I formulate an idea and then begin to research as I develop the characters and storyline. That way, I remain flexible in my thinking. If the character needs to carry a gun, I will find out what make he might choose and if they have any faults. If the hero or villain has a cheap weapon, it might jam at a tense moment creating some edge to the tale. If he is taking the underground in New York, I will look up route numbers and timetables

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
