

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
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A CONVERSATION WITH THE AUTHOR

WHY DID YOU WRITE 'A WOMAN'S PLACE'? WHAT WERE YOUR INSPIRATIONS?

I wanted to write a story in which the environment was a protagonist. To do that I needed to show the same place over a longer period, hence the family saga/historical elements. The magical realism aspect and the hostility of the land-spirit towards men and colonisation was not originally intended but now seems necessary.

WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF 'A WOMAN'S PLACE AND TO YOUR CHARACTERS WITHIN?

I liked the idea of a story where the land was central. I also like writing about strong, resourceful women. As far as characters go, I needed someone interested in history and with a strong connection to the 'place' which ended up being Julia. I also knew I needed to begin my story in colonial Australia which was how Alice came about. The others fell into place as the family became real to me.

I try to make the characters true to their historical/environmental settings. To be believable they also need emotional/intellectual motivation to act/react as they do.



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
